September is Attendance Awareness Month, and studies show that there is a direct link between absenteeism and high school dropouts. Statistics tell us that three-fourths of students who are chronically absent (10 or more days) in sixth grade will drop out of high school and that a student who is chronically absent in high school is 7.4 times more likely to drop out. **It is up to us to give children a reason to stay in school** (Dr. Addis, CEO Dropout Prevention Center)

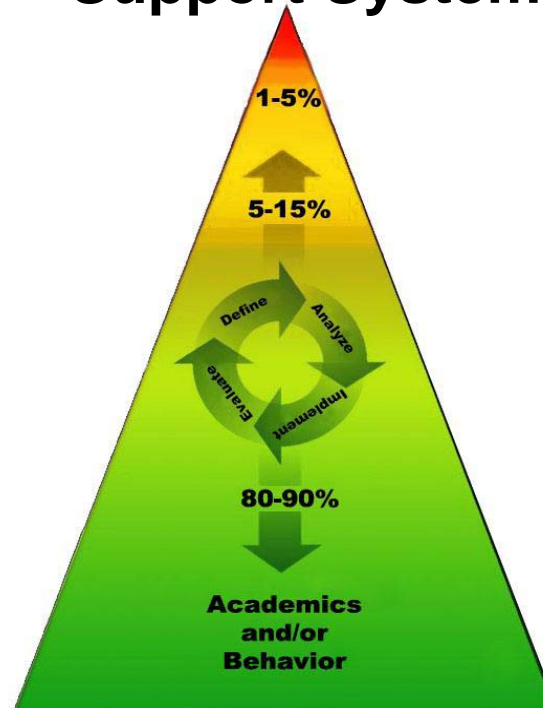
Attendance Focus

Tier III: Comprehensive and Intensive Interventions
(Few Students and Parents)
who need Individualized Interventions
(students missing 20% or more of school—Server Chronic absence

Tier II: Strategic Interventions
(Some Students and Parents)
Students who need more support to attend school more often *in* addition to the core curriculum (Students missing 10-19%:--moderate chronic absence

Tier I: ABCs
All
Stakeholders (Students missing 5-9% (at-risk); students missing less than 5% have satisfactory attendance

2015-16 Chronic Absenteeism reported from the Florida Department of Education released, HCPS were 10-14.9% (20,000 students est.) of students were absent less than 90%
**HCPS Cohort 2014 Graduation Data reflects 14% of students were absent less than 90%
